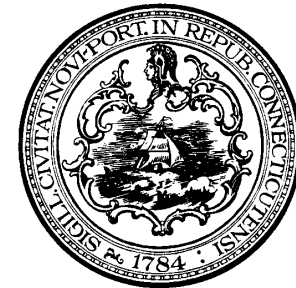

Homeowners

(Table A)

Property owners/life use and/or spouses who are 65 years of age by the end of the calendar year preceding the filing period (Feb.1 – May 15). If you have missed this deadline, the deadline to petition for extension from the State of CT Office of Policy and Management is August 15th. Please Contact the Assessor's office at 203-946-4800 for additional details.

Totally disabled persons are eligible regardless of age as long as they provide proof of award of total permanent disability during at least during the previous calendar year. The income limits for the program are set yearly (Table A). The claimant must reside at the property. Tax credits, once filed for and approved by the Assessor, generally extend for a two year assessment period.

City Senior Tax Relief

To qualify, you must be at least 70 years of age or older and have resided in New Haven for at least 10 years. The filing period is Feb.1 – May 15. If eligible, taxes will be stabilized as of the date of initial application until the subsequent revaluation. If your net income is under \$61,110 your taxes can be abated up to \$2,000. Anything over \$2,000 can be deferred until the sale of property or time of death. If you're net income is between \$61,110 and \$91,670 the tax savings will be deferred until the sale of property or time of death. Tax credits, once filed for and approved by the Assessor, generally extend for a two year assessment period.

Veterans

(Table B)

This exemption is available to veterans who have served in one of the armed services and who served at least 90 days during a period of war (Table F). The claimant must file an honorable discharge (DD-214) prior to October 1st with the City Clerk. Exemptions are also available to veterans who have suffered a disability.

Low Income Veterans

(Table C)

Any person entitled to an exemption from property tax in accordance with the above is eligible for additional veteran benefits, provided they meet the income requirements (See Table A). The filing period is between February 1st and October 1st.

Disabled Veterans

Veteran's who are disabled must request an annual letter of disability verification from the Veteran's Affairs Regional office and submit it to our office prior to March 31st.

City Additional Veterans

A married couples' income cannot exceed \$45,600 and an unmarried individual's income cannot exceed \$39,600. If eligible you will receive an exemption of \$10,000 or 10% of your total assessment, whichever is lower.

Active Duty Service Men

A Connecticut resident, who is an active duty member of the armed forces on the assessment date, is eligible for the total exemption of one Connecticut registered motor vehicle. A non-Connecticut resident whose vehicle is garaged in this state due to military orders is also entitled to an exemption.

Totally Disabled

(Table D)

Individual must possess a social security disability award letter or permanent total disability proof under any federal, state or local government retirement or disability plan. Application must be provided to the Assessor's Office by October 1st of any given assessment year.

Blind

(Table E)

This exemption is available to any blind person who presents an official certificate from a medical practitioner verifying his/her legal blindness. Application must be provided to the Assessor's Office by October 1st for any given assessment year.

Older adults (aged 60 and up) who are not on Medicaid, and who live on a low, fixed income, who are unable to pay their taxes should speak with Elderly Services. They will work with you. You may be eligible for a one-time form of assistance. Call 203-946-7854. You may be entitled to other benefits. Go to BenefitsCheckUp.org. You can also get help with this at any senior center.
