Send your Alder an email with questions or to ask to be put on their email list. Each Alder sends out periodic emails about events going on in the neighborhood.

The Board of Alders meets the first and third Monday of every month in the aldermanic chambers, 165 Church Street, second floor, except for holidays. During the summer, the Board of Alders meets the first Monday of the month. Check out a meeting!

The Farmington Canal

The Farmington Canal, also known as the New Haven and Northampton Canal, was a major private canal built in the early 19th century to provide water transportation from New Haven into the interior of Connecticut, Massachusetts and beyond.

During the 1990s, the railroad right-of-way was converted to a rail trail for recreational use.

The Farmington Canal Trail runs from downtown New Haven to Northampton, Massachusetts, closely following the path of Route 10.
