### **East Shore Park** 350 Woodward Avenue

A huge playground in the huge East Shore Park. East Shore Park has an ice rink, tennis courts, access to the water, and several playing fields. Hannah's Dream includes a sandbox (bring your own toys), several swing stations, and several play structures, including half a dozen slides. One section is for younger kids.



### **Lighthouse Park** 2 Lighthouse Point Road

Lighthouse Park is famous for its beach and its old-style carousel. There's an extensive newer playground. With the new structures and a fabulous new water park, Lighthouse Park becomes a real destination (there's a \$10/car entry sometimes for non-residents).

There are bathrooms, with the level of cleanliness one usually associates with beach facilities.

**Pardee Seawall Park**  
Townsend Avenue

Pardee Park is a narrow linear park providing wonderful views of Morris Cove and a concrete walkway for strolling in the neighborhood scale along New Haven Harbor. Trail connections to Fort Nathan Hale Park to the north allow for a longer waterfront walk.

## *Parks*

**Fort Nathan Hale**  
Woodward Road Avenue

Fort Nathan Hale Park is named for Connecticut's favorite son, Nathan Hale, who is said to have had but one regret: having but one life to lose for his country. This waterfront park offers a harbor setting as well as a sandy beach for sunbathers. Fish off the access pier or bring binoculars to watch the birds and the wildlife. Trails allow closer observation of the wildlife. Interpretive signage along the trails educates visitors about marshland and some of the historic and cultural values at this site. A pavilion at the park will provide shade from the summer sun. A family friendly playground is available on this site. Sanitary facilities are available.
