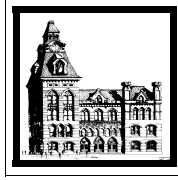


City of New Haven Democracy School

Mayor John DeStefano, Jr.'s Democracy School will introduce residents to City Hall's structure, services, and leaders through a public information forum where citizens are provided useful information on how city government operates, which will open lines of communication and enable citizens to better utilize City resources.

The Democracy School is open to **any New Haven resident, at least 18 years old**. Because space is limited, 25 students will be accepted based on submitted applications.

Democracy School Goals

- Provide participants with an interactive learning experience that generates dialogue about city services, programs and responsibilities, including day-to-day operations, the challenges to city government, and budget limitations.
- Promote partnerships between community and government by providing a forum where local government officials and local community members can interact and exchange ideas.

The Democracy School will meet on **Wednesday nights, 6:00 pm – 8:00 pm** for seven weeks. Refreshments will be provided by area restaurants.

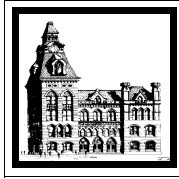
Requirements
