The City of New Haven is graced with many monuments that serve as landmarks, historical markers and noted works of public art. In 2003, The Department of Parks, Recreation & Trees established a program to conserve and maintain its monuments. Conservation work varies for each monument but may include removal of corrosion, stains and graffiti, sculptural and masonry repairs, general cleaning and placement of protective coatings.

In 2001, ECPC raised funds through our Monument Conservation Program to restore the Timothy Ahearn Memorial in West River Memorial Park. During the fall of 2003, the Parks Department hired a conservator to assess the condition of all Parks monuments and plaques. Thus far, in addition to the Columbus Monument, he has completed work on the Broadway Civil War Memorial (Broadway triangle at Broadway and Elm Street), the Bushnell Memorial at Monitor Square (Chapel Street and Derby Avenue), the Soldier's Monument at Bayview Park (Sixth Street), the U.S. Marine in Edgewood Park, and the Westville Soldiers Memorial in Beecher Park (Whalley Avenue at the Mitchell Library). The Angel of Peace statue is scheduled to be reinstalled on Soldiers & Sailors Monument.



The City of New Haven and Elms City Parks Conservancy are partnering to establish a fund to provide for restoration of additional monuments and to provide for their ongoing maintenance.
