A Healthier and More Beautiful Duck Pond

The upcoming West River tide gate project will reintroduce controlled tidal flows in the river, which will significantly improve water quality, fish passage, wildlife habitat, and opportunities for recreational use. The Duck Pond will also benefit from these same positive changes.

In order for park-goers to fully view and access the reinvigorated Duck Pond, some modifications to the existing landscaping are needed. We now have a set of changes to walkways, vegetation, and other landscaping that incorporates community feedback from February's public meeting. At this meeting, we will present the design plans and receive comments about enhancements to the Duck Pond and adjoining soccer field.

For generations, park visitors have enjoyed waterfowl and water views at the edge of the Duck Pond. We are committed to not only protecting this experience, but making it better.
